

**Appointments** 

<u>RECOMMENDED ACTION:</u> Appoint Commissioners to the 2022-2023 Harry Barovsky Memorial Youth Commission.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact associated with the recommended action.

<u>WORK PLAN:</u> This item was included as item 7.i. in the Adopted Work Plan for Fiscal Year 2021-2022.

<u>DISCUSSION:</u> On November 8, 1999, the Harry Barovsky Memorial Youth Commission (Commission) was established by the Council to serve as a voice for the youth of Malibu. Each year, the Commission facilitates opportunities for teens to gain leadership and volunteer experience through meetings, programs, and events. Commissioners also find solutions to issues related to local youth, demonstrate leadership amongst their peers, and promote civic responsibility.

In 2016, the Council adopted Resolution No. 16-46 (Attachment 1) based on the Commission's recommendation and modified the Commission structure and application process to include:

- The Commission shall be comprised of no less than seven and no more than twenty-five members
- All applicants are required to participate in an interview process in order to be considered for appointment to the Commission

• Once the interview process is completed, successful candidates would be presented at a Regular City Council meeting for appointment to the Commission by a majority vote of the Council at large

The application period for the 2022-2023 Youth Commission closed on Thursday, March 31, 2022, yielding 21 complete applications. Of the 21 completed applications, 17 are current Commissioners, three have not served on the Commission, and one is a former Commissioner.

Staff recommends the Council appoint the 21 applicants (Attachments 2 and 3) to serve on the 2022-2023 Harry Barovsky Memorial Youth Commission.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 16-46**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MALIBU RECONSTITUTING THE HARRY BAROVSKY MEMORIAL YOUTH COMMISSION AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NOS. 10-38, 13-06, AND 13-32

The City Council of the City of Malibu does hereby find, order and resolve as follows:

## SECTION 1. Recitals.

- A. The City Council established the Harry Barovsky Memorial Youth Commission in 1999 by adoption of Resolution No. 99-94.
- B. On several occasions, the City Council modified the membership of the Commission.
- C. The City Council desires to establish the membership of the Youth Commission as up to twenty-five (25) members but at least seven (7) members, with representation from grades seven (7) through twelve (12).
- D. The City Council desires to modify the absence policy allowing a member of the Youth Commission to be absent from three (3) regular meetings during a twelve (12) month period. Commissioners will be required to attend one (1) Youth Commission sponsored event.

## SECTION 2.

- 1. **Creation of Youth Commission.** A Youth Commission is hereby created and established for the City of Malibu. The Youth Commission may be known and referred to, among other things as the "Harry Barovsky Memorial Youth Commission" or the "Youth Commission."
- 2. **Members.** The Youth Commission may consist of no less than seven (7) members and no more than twenty-five (25) members. Five Youth Commission members shall serve as the Executive Board. The Executive Board members shall be elected by Commission members. The Executive Board has final approval of Commission decisions an acts by majority vote. All Commission members shall be appointed by City Council and must reside within the City of Malibu or attend Malibu schools. Notwithstanding the number of members appointed, a quorum of the Youth Commission shall consist of seven (7) members or two-thirds of the members, whichever is less, where at least (3) three of the members present are Executive Board Members. All decisions on votes taken shall require a majority of the quorum present.
- 3. **Appointments.** The members of the Youth Commission will be appointed by a majority vote of the members of the City Council. Applicants must participate in an interview process in order to be considered as a Youth Commission applicant. Appointments shall be made at a regular City Council meeting.

- 4. **Terms.** Each member of the Youth Commission shall serve a one-year term commencing on July 1st for the ensuing school year. Effort shall be made for the members to represent grades seven through twelve. Following expiration of the term of office, each commissioner shall continue to serve until his or her successor is appointed and qualified. Notwithstanding any provision of this code, each commissioner shall serve at the pleasure of the City Council and may be removed by the Council at a regular City Council meeting.
- 5. **Vacancies.** Vacancies on the Youth Commission shall be filled by appointment through a majority vote of the City Council.
- 6. **Absence from Meetings & Events.** If a member of the Youth Commission is absent from three (3) regular meetings in a twelve-month period without being excused or if a member does not attend one (1) Commission sponsored event, the office of such member shall be deemed vacated and the Chair will immediately notify the City Manager, who shall notify the City Council that that office is vacant. A successor for the remainder of the term of such absent member will be appointed as provided under Section 3. Appointments.
- 7. **Regular Meetings.** Regular meeting days of the Youth Commission shall be determined by resolution of the Youth Commission, except that the Commission's regular meetings will be at least once monthly.
- 8. **Duties.** The Youth Commission may make recommendations to the City Council with respect to matters concerning the City's programs and projects targeted to serve youth people in the community. The Youth Commission will have the authority and responsibility to plan, organize and implement, with the assistant of appropriate members of the City staff and within budget limits, events, programs and activities for the young people of the community and to hold fundraising events to further the work of the Youth Commission. All money raised will be restricted so that it is used exclusively to support the work of the Commission, its events, programs and activities.
- 9. **Records.** Accurate and permanent records of the actions of the Commission shall be kept, and such records shall have the same status as records of other administrative departments of the City.
- 10. **Organization.** The Youth Commission will elect one (1) of its members to serve as Chair. The election will be held at least annually at the Commission' regular meeting in September of each year. The Chair will be a member of either grade eleven or twelve. The Chair will serve at the pleasure of the Commission. The Commission may adopt such rules and regulations as it deems necessary to provide for its other officers and their method of selection, and for other matters relative to its work and administration. Minutes, resolutions and official records of the Commission will be file with the City Clerk.
- 11. **Compensation.** Members of the Youth Commission will serve without compensation. Expenses incurred by members of the Commission in the performance of their duties will be authorized in advance by the City Manager or his or her designee and will be consistent with the adopted budget of the City. Claims for expenses will be filed with the

Administrative Services Department and will be subject to audit and to the approval of the City Council.

SECTION 3. Resolution Nos. 10-38, 13-06, and 13-32 are hereby rescinded.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.



Being involved in my school has been an essential part of my time in high school. This past year I have been a member of the current events club, book club, math and science club, women's coalition, and student senate. Being a student senate member, I have actively been involved with coordinating after-school activities, dances, and school events. This past year as more opportunities have become available, I have helped collaborate with my school's administrators in providing resources for students to get more involved with extracurricular activities in the Los Angeles area. Fusion Academy does not have sports teams, so I have focused on collaborative projects throughout my three years there. In my sophomore year, I proposed that the school should have more open discussions about mental health, which I have been working on since then. This Summer and into the next school year, I am starting a mental health coalition. Although this is in the works, I have put a lot of work into planning the coalition, so I thought it was worth mentioning.

## Describe any work or volunteer experience you have\*

Since I was thirteen, I have tutored and babysat various kids in Malibu, which started my love of helping others. I am also a certified nursing assistant, and during training, I had to undergo 180 hours of work experience to get my certification in addition to the state test. This past year I have also prioritized volunteering. In the Fall, I got accepted to be a volunteer for Teen Line, a hotline for teens by teens. I went through 60 hours of training and have been a listener since December of 2021. More recently, I went through a volunteer orientation to be a volunteer at Los Robles Hospital in Thousand Oaks, which I plan to become more involved in during the Spring and Summer.

#### Describe any leadership experience \*

I served as the research project leader through the Aspiring Scholars Directed Research Program. We wrote a paper on the comprehensive review of therapeutic treatments for amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, which we are currently awaiting publication in a student journal. I also interned for Creative Visions for a year and would work on coordination and collaboration. I gave a presentation on behalf of Creative Visions on creative activism through science at the YOUNGA conference. Toward the end of my internship, I served as a senior intern. Additionally, during my time at Our Lady of Malibu, I served as a treasurer and student body present of the student council. At Fusion, I co-head the student senate meetings, and as I mentioned, I will be the chair and founder of the mental health coalition coming this Summer.

#### Why are you interested in joining the Youth Commission?\*

I am interested in joining the youth commission for the second year because I can be more engaged and help advocate for the younger people in our community. I've lived in Malibu my whole life, and as I've grown as a person, I've been more aware of the challenges we've faced as a community, from the homeless crisis, pollution, rising sea levels, etc. When I went into a high school outside of Malibu, I felt disconnected from the place I call home. When I heard about the Youth Commission a little over a year ago, I saw it as the perfect opportunity for me to get reintegrated into the community. I am proud to have served on the commission for this past year and our accomplishments. However, being virtual imposed a challenge of being able to connect and collaborate to our potential. This next year, I am excited to be in person with my peers and touch on issues post-pandemic such as mental health awareness and reestablishing connectivity among the residents of Malibu.
