FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact associated with the recommended action.

WORK PLAN: This item was not included in the Adopted Work Plan for Fiscal Year 2020-2021. This is part of normal staff operations.

DISCUSSION: The reorganization of and appointment to City Council Subcommittees, Ad Hoc Committees and Outside Agencies occurs after the City's General Municipal Election held in November of even-numbered years.

On November 14, 2022, the Council directed staff to bring back an item in January 2023 to form and appoint members to an Ad Hoc Committee to review the City's Road Race Policy and the proposed Super League Triathlon agreement and return to the City Council with a recommendation. The Council may formally establish the Road Race Ad Hoc Committee now and appoint two members.

If so, the Ad Hoc Committee should be dissolved.
