Subject: Mid-Year Commission Activity Reports

<u>RECOMMENDED ACTION:</u> 1) Receive and file mid-year activity reports from the Harry Barovsky Memorial Youth Commission, Malibu Arts Commission, Parks and Recreation Commission, Public Safety Commission, and Public Works Commission; and 2) Amend Commission assignments for Fiscal Year 2022-2023, if appropriate.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT:</u> There is no fiscal impact associated with the recommended action. Additional funds may need to be allocated if changes are made to any Commission's Work Plan.

<u>WORK PLAN:</u> This item was not included in the Adopted Work Plan for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. This project is part of normal staff operations.

<u>DISCUSSION:</u> At its June 18, 2022 Regular meeting, the City Council approved Fiscal Year 2022-2023 assignments for the City's Commissions (excluding the Planning Commission). In an effort to improve communication between the Commissions and the Council, and to keep the Council informed of the Commissions' efforts on behalf of the City, the Council requested mid-year written reports from each Commission.

The Commissions met regularly during the first half of the year and focused their work plans on accomplishing the tasks listed in the assignments. Attached are summaries of commission activities from the first half of the year (July through December 2022), along with the corresponding Fiscal Year 2022-2023 assignments for each Commission.

SUBJECT: Malibu Arts Commission Mid-Year Commission Activity Report

As directed by the City Council at its June 13, 2022 Regular meeting, the Malibu Arts Commission submits the following summary of its activities during the first half of Fiscal Year 2022-2023 (July through December), approved at the Commission's Regular meeting on November 22, 2022:

- Closed the *Art of Surf* exhibition in August 2022 and curated two art exhibitions at the Malibu City Gallery: The S. Heather Edwards exhibition took place from October to November 2022, and the *Music Inspired Art* exhibition took place from December 2022 to January 2023 and featured 20 local artists.
- Reviewed and provided feedback on marketing, social media, and website content for the Malibu Arts Commission website
- Reviewed and provided feedback on the Arts in Education program, which included multi-week poetry workshops at Malibu Middle School and distance learning classrooms
- The Art and Business Ad Hoc Committee met with the Malibu Chamber of Commerce to discuss opportunities to promote artists in local businesses, which has resulted in the formation of the Art Share Program and community art events.
- Provided feedback regarding art events, programs, and projects
- Conducted a Call for Artists for the Caltrans Solstice Canyon Creek Beautification Project. The Commission drafted art submission guidelines, reviewed artist proposals, and recommended muralist Jules Muck for the project.
- Discussed options for an Arts Center in Malibu. To gain community feedback, the Commission will release a Malibu Arts Center survey in early 2023.
